Emergency Medical Responder Bridge Course

The Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Bridging course is an entry-level Paramedic course that will prepare individuals for employment in a variety of pre-hospital, industrial and first responder settings. The EMR course is designed to provide participants with the basic knowledge and skills to be able to manage any medical and trauma related emergency.

The EMR course is an entry-level training course that provides the skills and knowledge required to practice as an Emergency Medical Responder.

At the end of the EMR course you will be able to:

- Perform a standardized patient assessment
- Conduct a scene assessment
- Assess and manage life-threatening traumatic emergencies
- Assess and manage life-threatening medical emergencies
- Assess patient vital signs
- Monitor patient blood pressure and pulse oximetry
- Conduct a secondary assessment consisting of a physical examination, medical history, and vital signs
- Conduct chest auscultation
- Administer CPR according to the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada
- Perform basic wound and fracture management including the application of a Sager Splint
- Maintain airways and ventilation using Pocket Mask and Bag-Valve-Mask devices
- Meet all Occupational First Aid Level III requirements
- Conduct lifting, loading, extrication, and transportation of patients
- Perform spinal immobilization and cervical immobilization
- Perform emergency childbirth
- Perform oropharyngeal airway suctioning
- Perform oxygen administration
- Perform Automated External Defibrillation (AED)
- Maintain intravenous lines
- Administer the following oral, sublingual, or inhaled medications: Nitroglycerin, Glucocel, Nitrous Oxide (Entonox)

The EMR Bridging course is 5 days in length with one day of exam. This course requires students to have successfully completed an OFA Level 3 (2 week) course prior to starting.

CITXW NLAKA'PAMUX ASSEMBLY EMPLOYMENT & TRAINING OCCUPATIONAL FIRST AID LEVEL 3

Occupational First Aid Level 3 is a 2 week/70 hour program designed to further first aid training and knowledge. The OFA Level 3 course is suitable for people in these industries: lumber mill, pulp and paper mill, medic for oil and gas in BC (Alberta may require extra training), large logging companies, large road construction and flagging. No prior first aid knowledge required to attend this course. All students must be at least 16 years old and physically able to perform first aid.

- Operate oxygen therapy equipment and insert oral airways
- Medical emergencies
- Skin and soft tissue anatomy and function
- Management of soft tissue injuries
- Principles of burn management

- Patient positioning
- Critical incident stress
- Manage oral airways
- Patient packaging for rapid transport
- Management of circulatory emergencies
- Manage circulatory critical interventions

- General principles of management for fractures and dislocations

Participants learn skills required for effective interface fuel management including chainsaw operation and maintenance, brush saw operation and safety, line cutting, and pile and slash burning. Participants learn to identify related Occupational Health and Safety regulations, perform saw maintenance, correct chain filing procedures and safe cutting techniques, identify bucking and limbing hazards, complete basic chainsaw bucking cuts on level terrain, fuel collection, and safe controlled pile burning procedures. Successful participants achieve a Power Saw Operator certificate valid for 4 years.
